	students can take some designated undergraduate courses along with Japanese
	Language and Culture courses.
	Please note that in general "Elementary Japanese I" is offered only in the Fall
	semester. "Elementary Japanese II" in the Spring semester is designed for those
	students who have attended approximately 150-hour of class time in first-year
	level Japanese. Please inform us in advance when your student whose Japanese
	proficiency is at elementary level wish to apply for Spring semester.

	or exchange students as soon as it is issued.
	3. Students have to apply for a college student visa at the nearest Japanese
	Consulate with the letter and the certificate.
