Learn Japanese for the real world.

The Center for Japanese Language and Culture (CJLC) has been a place for international students, hailing from all over the world, to attain a high level of Japanese language skills that can be practically applied to a wide range of situations and for diverse purposes. In 2019, the campus for CJLC will change locations to the Hoshigaoka campus, along with a new program. While maintaining the same quality of individualized education, the program now features increased practical experience in Japanese language and culture through new courses that include Japanese students.

Small class size for individualized instruction

We offer instruction in a small class setting in order to maintain a curriculum that serves each student as individual learners. At each level, students can receive one-to-one lessons with an assigned instructor, focusing on the needs of the student.

Study with Japanese students

Undergraduate courses, taken by native Japanese students, are incorporated into the curriculum for upper level students, providing unique experiences that will enhance the students' Japanese language ability and cultural understanding.

The best of both worlds

Study at the Hoshigaoka Campus, which is located conveniently near public transportation and a popular shopping district, full of restaurants and cafes. You can easily go to local museums, the Nagoya Castle, and other trendy spots after class. The dormitory is located in Nagakute, a 20-minute shuttle bus ride (free) from the Hoshigaoka Campus, offering a comfortable environment suitable to students.



Financial Information

The following is a summary of estimated fees and expenses for 2019.

*The above fees are subject to change without notice.

*1) Admitted students are required to submit 120,000 yen (100,000 for class tuition, 20,000 for admission fees) upon declaring their intent to enter the program. In the event that the student decides not to enter the program, this payment will not be refunded.

*2) The security deposit is used to pay for any liabilities the student incurs. Any unused funds will be returned to the student upon completion of the program.



ASU Alumni Scholarship for International Students

This scholarship is awarded to outstanding students on the basis of academic achievements at the Center for Japanese Language and Culture.

- Amount: 100,000 yen

Students are required to be registered at the university at the time of payment; and therefore, international students registered for only one semester program are ineligible.

Health Services and Insurance

1. National Health Insurance

International students living in Japan must join the National Health Insurance (NHI). NHI covers 70% of the total medical expenses when you receive treatment at medical institutions. The insurance fees differ depending on the city or ward the student reside. The average annual premium in Nagakute city is approximately 12,000 yen.

2. Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) and Liability Insurance

All ASU students must join Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS). This insurance covers unexpected physical injuries incurred while engaging in educational and research activities on and off campus. In addition, all students must join Liability Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research. This insurance covers compensation when a student causes damage to others or their belongings during educational and research activities and while commuting between university facilities and between the university and the place of residence. The insurance fee for PAS is 800 yen per year and 340 yen per year for Liability Insurance.

■ Housing — International House (iHouse)

International House (iHouse) is a dormitory on **the Nagakute Campus**. On the 1st floor, there are classrooms, tatami rooms, a tea ceremony room, a multipurpose lounge, and a kitchen. Dormitory rooms for international students are on the 2nd and 3rd floors. There is a live-in dormitory manager. Japanese resident assistants also live in this iHouse to provide support to international students.

All rooms are single rooms.

[Number of Rooms] 29 rooms on the 2nd floor, 24 rooms on the 3rd floor

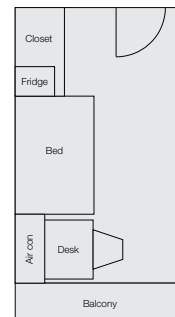

Common Facilities

iHouse's common facilities include a kitchen, living room, dining room, study room (only on 3rd floor), mini lounges, shower rooms, restrooms, laundry room (washer, dryer), and vending machines. There are laptop computers in the study room and Wi-Fi in the living room available for student use.

■ Support for International Students

There is a support system for international students (Buddy System for International Students) offered by Japanese student volunteers. Events are regularly held by volunteers, including lunch exchange meetings and sports events.



Program Outline

The Aichi Shukutoku University Center for Japanese Language and Culture offers Japanese language courses that match the individual level of each student, and courses in Japanese culture that place an emphasis on practical experience. Undergraduate courses are incorporated into the curriculum to give our students opportunities to study and learn with Japanese students.

There are six levels of instruction, from “Basic Japanese I” to “Advanced Japanese II.” Individual instruction time called “Tutorial” is set aside at each level. Students are provided with one-on-one lessons from their assigned teacher focusing on individual problem areas.

Requirements for Completion

The period of study at the Center for Japanese Language and Culture is one year. However, those who fulfill certain conditions will be permitted to extend their period of study for up to one additional year.

Students receive a certificate of completion upon successfully fulfilling the requirements below.

- Completion of two semesters of study
- Earning a minimum of 28 credits with at least 14 credits earned each semester
- Of these 14 credits mentioned above, 12-16 credits (depending on the student's level) per semester must be Japanese language credits

Annual Schedule

The Japanese Studies Program starts in September and ends in August.

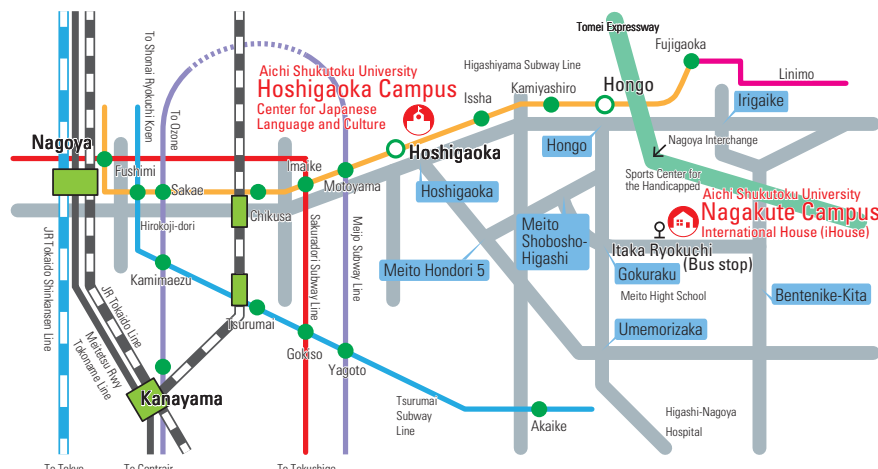
- 4** Beginning of spring semester (Apr. 13th)

■ Access to Aichi Shukutoku University

Aichi Shukutoku University has two campuses: the Nagakute Campus and the Hoshigaoka Campus. Classes of the Center for Japanese Language and Culture are held at the Hoshigaoka Campus, and the student dormitory is located on the Nagakute Campus. Students can use the shuttle bus between the campuses free of charge.

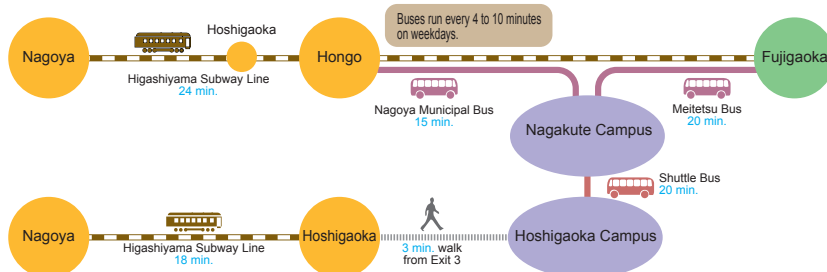

18 minutes from Nagoya Station to Hoshigaoka Station on the Higashiyama Subway Line. A 3-minute walk from the No. 3 exit.

NAGAKUTE Campus International House (iHouse)

24 minutes from Nagoya Station to Hongo Station on the Higashiyama Subway Line. Take a city bus from Hongo Station to Itaka Ryokuchi and get off the bus at the last stop. (Itaka Ryokuchi Stop is right in front of ASU.) It takes about 15 minutes.
