Student Life and Support

Aichi Shukutoku University offers various support for international students to help them in settling down comfortably in Japan.









Buddy Program

We can partner international students with ASU students as buddies to help them settle into university life during the first month of your study period at ASU.

RA (Resident Assistant)

RAs are live-in students at iHouse to support positive on-campus living experiences for international students. They also host various events for international students.

Global Lounge

Global Lounge is a mult-lingual and multi-cultural space located in the Hoshigaoka campus where students can interact with others with diverse background.

Dormitory: iHouse (International House)

iHouse was built in 2013 on the Nagakute Campus with 53 single rooms for international students. A live-in dormitory manager and Resident Assistants (RA) assist international students in their adjustment to a new environment.

- Common Facilities: kitchen, a living and dining room, a study room, shower rooms, toilets, laundry rooms, vending machine, mini lounges
- Basic Room Facilities: Single bed frame and mattress, desk and chair, desk lamp, refrigerator, air conditioner, closet, curtains, internet connection









Nagakute City and Living Environment

The Nagakute Campus, where the International Student Dormitory (iHouse) is located, is a quiet and calm residential area, yet offers a convenient and comfortable student life with all the necessary facilities for daily living. Nagakute City is also home to Ghibli Park, which has attracted many tourists in recent years.
