Qualifica- tions for applicants	 Applicants must have completed twelve years of mandatory education and be eligible to enter university, or the equivalent. Applicants must have achieved grades of at least 75 points on a 100-point scale, or a 2.75 GPA on a 4.00 scale at their host universities.

Qualifications for applicants	 English proficiency shall be equivalent to TOEFL iBT 71, IELTS 5.5 (CEFR B2 level) or above for non-native English speakers. * It is not mandatory to submit the official score report of TOEFL or IELTS. In case the applicant does not have the official score report, an official letter from their home university which certifies that his/her English proficiency is equivalent or beyond the above-mentioned requirements, will serve. 2) Grade F (Fail) must be less than 10% of the total academic results at the last educational institution.
Notes	Japanese courses (classes of Faculty of Global Communication) "Introductory Japanese A" or "Introductory Japanese B" (90 minutes lecture, twice a week, 15 weeks, 4 credits) are available for the students. Depending on the student's Japanese level, they may also be able to take some

Information upon arrival (in chronological order)		
Student visa	 Accepted students will receive a "Certificate of Admission" from Aichi Shukutoku University (ASU hereafter). The "Certificate of Admission" will be available for download from the online application system. ASU will apply for the "Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)" to the Nagoya Regional Immigration Bureau on behalf of the student. Once ASU receives the CoE from the Nagoya Regional Immigration Services Bureau, ASU will forward it to the exchange student's email. Students must apply for a student visa at the nearest embassy or consulate of Japan with the "Certificate of Admission" and the "Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)" forwarded via email. Other documents specified by the embassy or consulate may be required. 	
Fix arrival date	Students are required to enter Japan only after obtaining a student visa. The period of visa application may vary depending on countries/regions. ASU will send the "Certificate of Eligibility" two week before pick-up dates at the latest . Please arrange your flight carefully, considering the time required for visa application procedures.	
Airport pick- up service	This service is available, at no cost, for the arrival at Chubu Centrair International Airport. * The schedule will be announced as soon as it is decided.	
Accommodation	Exchange students are requested to live in iHouse, ASU's on-campus international dormitory. *Check-in date will be announced as soon as it is decided. Curfew is 24:00. Entering the iHouse after curfew will only be allowed if reported in advance.
